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Why do we elect Mayors & Councillors?

Most people think they have a “*Local Government*” (elected representatives). But what’s operating day-to-day is “*Municipal Administration*” (operations).

Elected Officials are called “*government*” because we grant them *our consent to administrate our public affairs*. It’s a representative role, which means Officials are to be 100% accountable to those who put them into Office.

Every office requires a man or woman decision-maker, however their authority is exercised through an office chair. This maintains continuity of government during election cycles.

Local government involves both *Public Administration (money)* and *Municipal Administration (services)* to operate simultaneously and in unison.

However, since 2001, the line between the *Public Institution* and the *Municipal Corporation* has become dangerously blurred.

***A Public Office HOLDS your money.
A Municipal Office SPENDS it.***

The Municipal Chair & The Public Man

When local elections shifted from a public function to a municipal one, it altered both the legal character of our local elections and the results.

Voters see “Mayor” on their ballot, yet the City Clerk issues the municipal title “Head of Council” at inauguration.

Mayoral Candidates are told their public duties are defined in the *Municipal Act*, but the word “Mayor” isn’t in it. When they question the Clerk about it, they’re told, “We call the ‘Mayor’ a ‘Head of Council’ ... *they mean the same thing.*”

NO, THEY ARE NOT THE SAME THING AT ALL!

A Head of Council is a *corporate* title for an administrator of a Municipal franchise.
A Mayor is the *fiduciary* title for a public administrator and a *peace officer in law*.

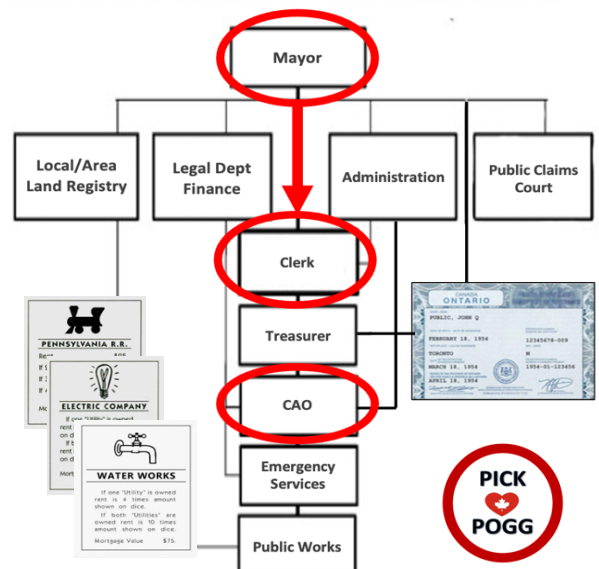

Public Office for the People

- The Municipal Office -

The Municipal Office runs the service corporation and its day-to-day operations. When Municipalities were redefined in 2001, CITY staff began running elections and issuing the foundational “Oaths.”

This role was used to incorporate all local institutions into the Municipality Structure.

Elected candidates are sworn in as “Members of Council”, strapped into a Municipality Chair, and reduced to *“Just one vote at the table.”*

Head of Council and Council Members MUST:

1. Take a Municipal Declaration (& title) in lieu of public Oath & fiduciary duty
2. Place Global Initiatives before local needs
3. Reach Net Zero CO₂ Emissions by 2050

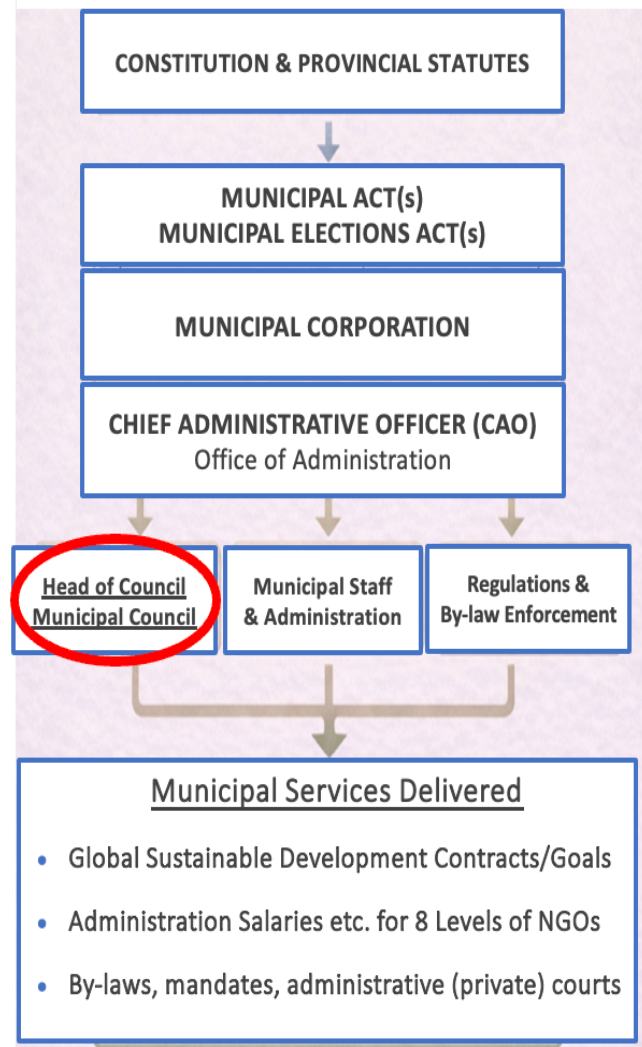

Municipal Government (Office of Head of Council)



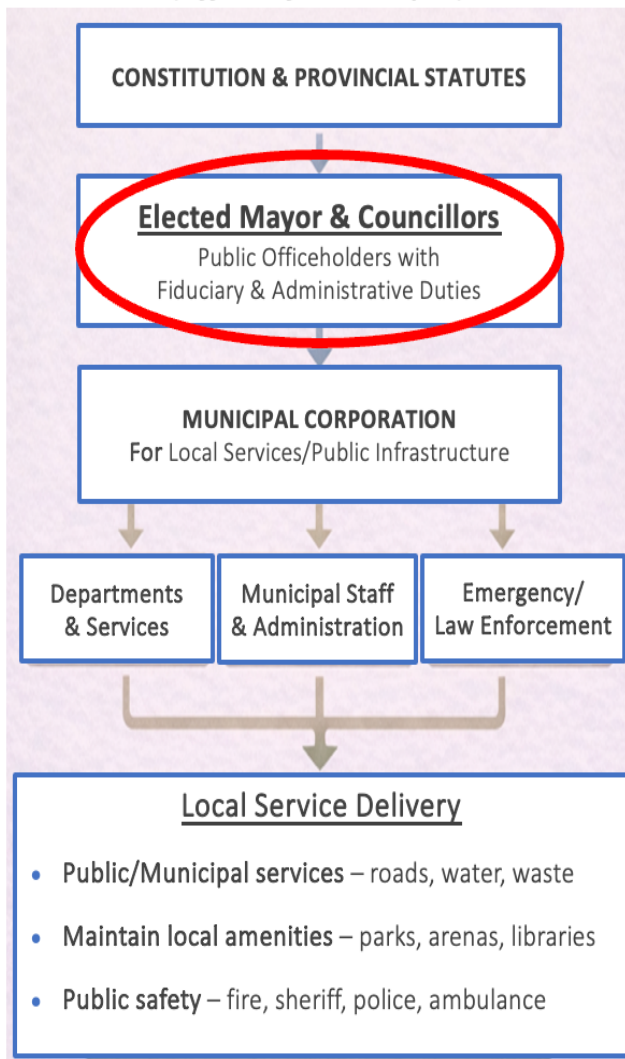
- The Public Office -



As elected trustees for public infrastructure, a Mayor's "role" carries **heightened** expectations of due diligence, fiscal responsibility, and **inherent** obligations of welfare and complete transparency.

Public service requires a conscience, loyalty and impartiality. Officials must be trust-worthy, and are **strictly prohibited** from using a public Office for personal, political or financial gain.

Local Government (Office of the Mayor)



Public Mayor/Councillors MUST ensure:

1. Oath of elected Office and local purview
2. Fiscal responsibility to the people
3. Powers used for public purpose only
4. Public input on ALL local developments
5. Service contracts to local people first
6. Properly maintained public infrastructure

OATH OF OFFICE Example (Town Act 1974)

3 Reasons Why Public & Municipal Must NOT Be Merged

1. Fiscal Control of Money, Public Assets and Infrastructure

Your birth certificate is proof of a public (life-interest) trust account registered in your name. It's a valuable "token" in the municipal system.

(More in the POGG Protocols: Emergency Estate Redemption)

This public account requires an authorized man or woman to guard/administrate it for you, and **public accounts MUST be kept separate** from the corporations charging the accounts for services.

This is the "Public" in EVERY Public/Private Partnership



This represents "money" in a fiat (pledging) currency system

2. Public Input & Accountability

Elected trustees have a much higher threshold for accountability than municipal employees since they oversee local revenue.

They **must** act in your best interest **and** answer all your questions.

3. Regulatory Control over Land, Public Services & Private Property

A public Office is to provide all essential services, free of charge, by using tax revenue or security set-off. If a private agreement takes over public infrastructure and services, it produces a system where:

- ⇒ water and hydro can be **shut off** for refusing a SMART meter
- ⇒ homes can be over-assessed to increase property taxes, and
- ⇒ by-laws are used to generate revenue, not for public safety.

3 Things a POGG Candidate Stands for:

1. **Fiscal Responsibility:** Good Government Administration
 - ⇒ Office and collected revenue are for public purpose only
 - ⇒ Terminate partnerships/agreements that were made beyond purview
 - ⇒ Financial Clearinghouse, forensic audit of all public accounts/resources
2. **Public Office Accountability:** 100% Office/holder transparency
 - ⇒ Public Oath of Office to the people (peaceful inhabitants)
 - ⇒ Unincorporate institution and residents (incorporated inhabitants)
 - ⇒ Clear local purview, no outside issues, no political affiliations
3. **Local Money For Local Issues Only:** Global goals are beyond office purview
 - ⇒ No more provincial (SDG) or international initiative downloads
 - ⇒ Service contracts tendered to local businesses and people first
 - ⇒ Funding available for public service work, humanitarian projects

No duty to help vulnerable	Custodial duty for the vulnerable
No liability for harm caused	Subject to conflict-of-interest principles



2026: Re-Public Your Public Office



- Step 1:** Read The POGG Primer, Protocol, and Playbook (≈ 20 pages each)
- Step 2:** Register to run for Mayor or Councillor or support a POGG Candidate
- Step 3:** Host town halls, “Meet & Greets”, put the POCKET POGG in mailboxes
- Step 4:** Share this information, educate sitting Officials and work together
- Step 5:** POGG Campaign is *only* about “the money” - NO DIVISIVE POLITICS
- Step 6:** If you win, take the Oath. If you lose, challenge the de facto Declarant

Re-Public Your UN-Public Office

Restoring Peace, Order & Good Governance

Unincorporating from the Municipality UN-Sustainable Structure

1. Newly elected candidates will be sworn in to serve the local area and people. The Public Oath establishes stewardship of local resources, public infrastructure and fiduciary duty.

Officeholder Purview/Jurisdiction:

Mayor: Chief Executor of local Public Trust(s); **peace officer**

Ward Councillors: Local Board of Trustees; **ward stewards**

2. Re-Public the Public Office: Restore

- (a) **Fiduciary Authority:** Local Treasury established. All taxes, fees & securities diverted to treasury deposit, independent of ServiceCITY franchise & central banking system.
- (b) **Judicial Authority:** Sheriff and deputies appointed, local courts re-established. All municipal police and by-law officers will be sworn under oath, not employed.
- (c) **Regulatory Control:** All PPP agreements & UN/WEF commitments terminated; forensic audit on all municipal accounts/contracts; “Pause” on all CITY By-laws.

3. **Unincorporate** “all things local” from the **United Nations CITY STATE corporate structure.**
(Municipality, Regional and District tiers used for Municipal (Global) Administration)
Fraud vitiates/nullifies ALL past, present and future obligations.

4. All **Municipal service contracts** reviewed; public services maintained (water, sewer, transit, schools etc.) **ALL municipal services billed to and paid by the Local Treasury.**

5. **Ward Councillors**, as public trustees/guardians for the “re-Public” transition, ensure every man/woman is informed of the de-amalgamation and correction of their public accounts.

Councillors start **Town Hall Meetings** to address emergency needs and infrastructure concerns. Immediate treasury funds available for housing, food, health care, seniors, small businesses, daycare/education, transportation, cost of living assistance etc.

All can be homed & helped.

6. A **new public voting system** is in development. Men/women will appoint their trustees directly, no longer by proxy for the postal code, resident or publicly-registered person.
